The Royal College of Pathologists of Australasia has endorsed the following Guidelines for this scholarship:

1. One scholarship will be made available annually to a student in a recognised dental school and one scholarship will be made available annually to a student undertaking an AIMS accredited science degree in a recognised university.
2. The scholarship, in the sum of AUD\$2,000, will be offered to a student undertaking a degree course within the jurisdictions the College serves, namely Australia, New Zealand, Hong Kong, Singapore and Malaysia
3. The scholarship will be offered annually for a project associated with pathology, jointly developed by a student and supervisor and designed for the duration of one elective term or the duration of the particular degree course.
4. The scholarship may be supervised by more than one supervisor, but at least one supervisor must be a Fellow of the Royal College of Pathologists of Australasia or a Fellow of a Faculty of the College.
5. The successful applicant will be selected on a competitive basis by an appointed College committee and selected on the basis of an application outlining the project, not exceeding 200 words.
6. The project design should be such that the student learns the principles of the scientific method in the practice of Pathology.
7. Previously successful applicants are not eligible to reapply.
8. The Royal College of Pathologists of Australasia must be acknowledged in any publication arising from the scholarship.
9. The scholarship is to be awarded prior to the commencement of the elective term.
10. Applications must be on the prescribed College form available on the College website at [www.rcpa.edu.au](http://www.rcpa.edu.au) and must be submitted by 31 May in any given year.
11. The Royal College of Pathologists of Australasia should receive a formal report on the project following its completion.
